





Girona was founded by the romans as Gerunda in the 1st century B.C.



LOCATION

Girona is a city on a human scale (100,000 inhabitants) with all the charm of a larger city.

Girona is a popular destination for tourists, and film productions have used it as a filming location (e.g., Game of Thrones, and Perfume: The Story of a Murderer).



The Old Quarter of the city is one of the most important medieval monumental ensembles of Catalonia.

The Jewish Quarter is one of the most interesting, emblematic areas in the city of Girona, both in terms of architecture and history.



CONFERENCE VENUE

The University of Girona (UdG) has a nice campus in the old town, at walking distance from hotels and restaurants.

The conference will take place at the Sant Domènec Church, which is part of the historic building of the UdG, and in an adjoining chapel and classrooms.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

By car

The road network around Girona, which follows the ancient Roman roads, includes the main national motorways, connecting with France and the rest of the principality with the motorways AP-7 and A-2.

By train

Girona also has a good rail network, with medium-distance regional trains and high speed trains (AVANT) connecting it with the city of Barcelona in 38 minutes. Likewise, the AVE line connects Girona with different cities in Spain and Europe.

By air

Girona - Costa Brava Airport

Girona - Costa Brava Airport is located just 13 kilometers from Girona city, counting on regular bus and taxi service to the city center. There are many direct flights to Girona from Europe. However, the frequency is quite low.

Barcelona Airport

In the absence of flights to Girona Airport (or excessively time-consuming), traveling to Girona through Barcelona Airport is a good option.

Reaching Girona from Barcelona Airport is easy. Terminal 2 of Barcelona Airport counts on a train station (line R2), that directly brings you to Barcelona Sants train station. From Barcelona Sants, high-speed rail can be taken to Girona train station, which takes about 38 min.







- 243 papers by 501 authors
 - 11 (4.5%) papers written by a single author
 - 7 (1.4%) authors did not co-write with others
 - 3.4 authors per paper on average
- Low density (0.008)
 - suggests opportunity for new collaboration patterns

Challenges

- Majority of Submissions: Solicited from authors of accepted CP and CPAIOR papers
- Many submissions to other AI journals
 - AIJ, JAIR
- Commitment from CP community
 - Authors, editors, reviewers
- Perceived by some to be insular
